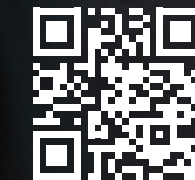




WELCOME TO CAPITAL LAW

A STEP ABOVE

At Capital Law, we know that becoming a lawyer requires you to not only learn the law, but also learn how to practice law. Our curriculum is designed to graduate legal professionals who are practice-ready; lawyers who are prepared to be successful and make a contribution their first day on the job. All students – full-time and part-time – are offered a practical education that is centered on experiential learning courses, externships, and clinical opportunities.

Here is a snapshot of the path at Capital Law:

First-Year Law

All 1L students work closely with the Office of Professional Development to identify one of four areas in which they would like to focus their studies. These areas include Business & Finance, Government & Public Policy, Public Interest & Justice, or Family & Estates. Students are matched with a faculty mentor who will guide their post-1L year course selection, allowing them to concentrate their learning in a specific area of legal study.

Professional Pathways

Law students have the option to explore a Professional Pathway and choose classes that focus on discrete areas of the law. Capital offers Professional Pathways in three areas: Compliance, Employment Law, and Intellectual Property. Each pathway integrates foundational knowledge, practice tools, and hands-on experiences. A brief description of each pathway is below.

PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE

At Capital Law, we promote a skills-based, practical education. This comes from a strong balance of legal theory taught in the classroom and the application of law in applied learning experiences. Beginning in your first year, you'll work with the Office of Professional Development and participate in 1:1 assessments, career planning, and job search strategies. Throughout law school and with the collaboration of the Office of Professional Development, you'll continue to explore externships, internships, clinical opportunities, and future employment.

During the third year of law school, students can represent real-world clients by participating in Capital University Law School's Legal Clinic. Students will serve clients and participate in true-to-life solutions that make an impact. Capital Law Clinics help you develop essential lawyering skills in interviewing, negotiation, client counseling, legal research, case management, and drafting legal documents – just to name a few. RAISING THE BAR

All incoming students participate in Fall Semester Launch activities offered through the Academic Success Program. Students engage in workshops, academic coaching, and individual skills instruction that provide them with tools they need to be successful throughout law school.

The Academic Success Program also offers training in case reading and briefing, exam writing, and note taking. Capital Law's Bar Success Program, offered to third-year law students, is designed to familiarize students with bar exam formats and test taking techniques that will help them succeed in any jurisdiction.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION

Capital Law's Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion plays a vital role in fostering a supportive learning environment on campus. We believe that a diverse and inclusive legal community leads to greater knowledge and empathy, and ultimately, better legal practitioners. 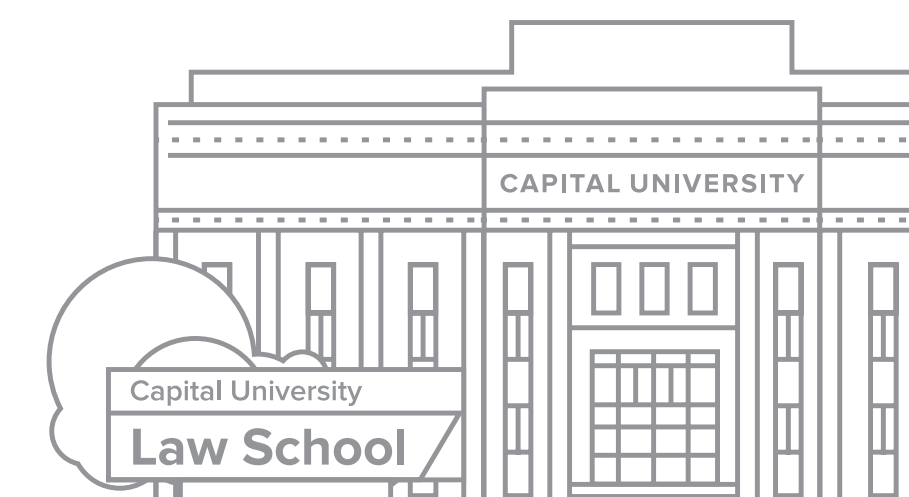

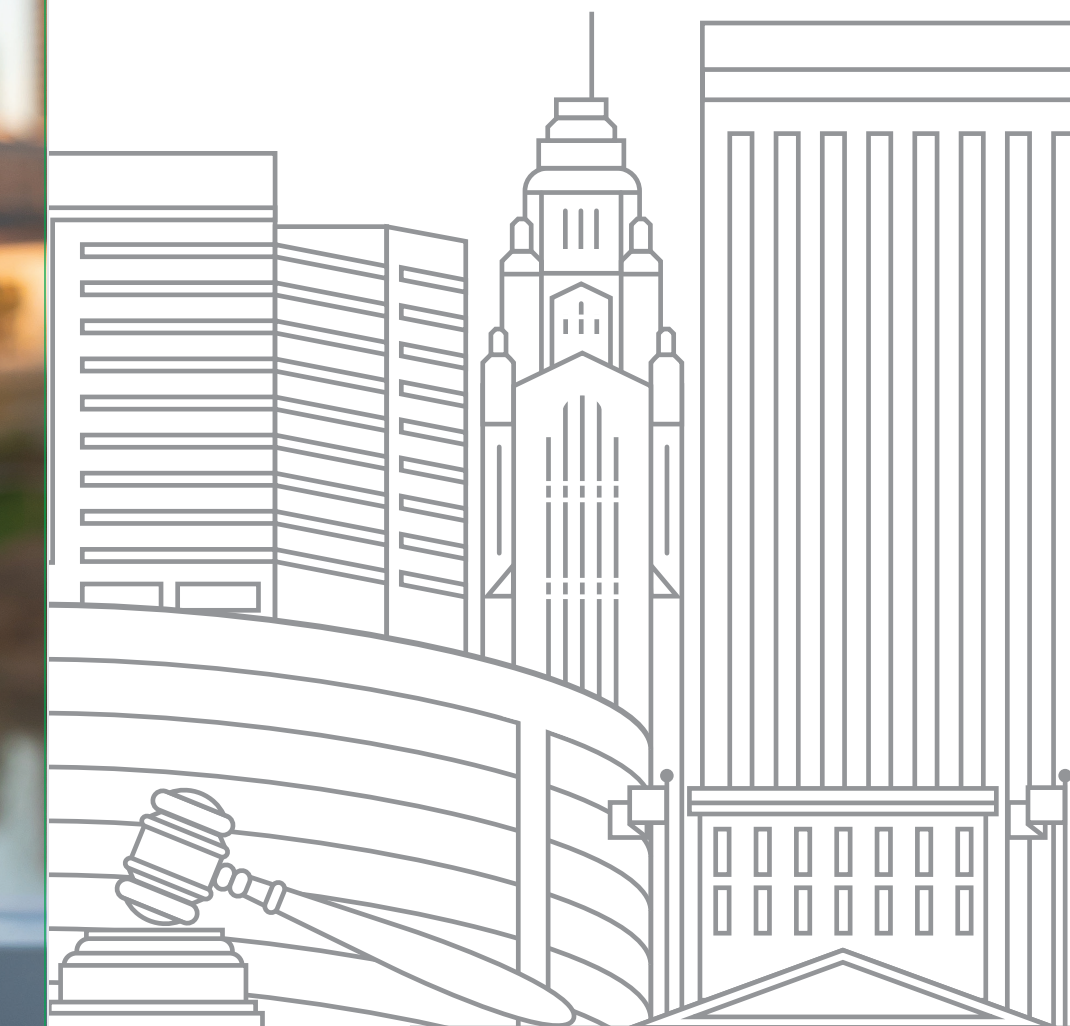
