

**CAPITAL UNIVERSITY LAW SCHOOL
LEGAL NURSE CONSULTANT PROGRAM
2013 SCHEDULE**

The Legal Nurse Consultant Professional Certificate Program requires the completion of 10 monthly modules. Each module consists of twenty (20) hours of “live” classroom time combined with sixteen (16) hours of distance learning and each module is a 500-level, 2-semester credit hour course. There is also a conference call each Thursday evening at 8pm EST during the 4 weeks following each module. In addition, there is a 2 hour orientation that is mandatory.

Therefore, please arrive at the Law School prior to 3:30pm on Friday, January 11, 2013 as from 3:30 – 4pm student ID photos will be taken and then there is the mandatory orientation session from 4pm to 6pm with pizza being served!

The monthly module classes take place on campus on the second weekend of every month beginning in January 2013 and ending in October 2013. A total of 20 credit hours plus the 2-hour orientation is required by the ABA for successful completion and graduation from the program. Students are required to complete the entire series of ten modules, and it is recommended it be done sequentially, however, the program can and must be completed within a two-year period.

During the program format, students may either: (1) take the modules in consecutive order, beginning in the Spring Semester (January) and ending the program in the Fall Semester (October); OR (2) students may start the program at any point, taking the modules out of order. The only exception is the I and II format modules which must be taken in sequence, and the LNC Practicum Module must be taken after all other modules have been completed.
