ATTENTION CURRENT FIRST-YEAR EVENING AND PART-TIME DAY STUDENTS

The Office of Records & Registration will not register you until you have submitted an Employment & Disclosure form.

UNDER/EXCESSIVE CREDIT HOURS

Any <u>FULL-TIME DAY</u> student registered for more than 16 credit hours must seek permission from the Associate Dean by completing a *Change in Registration Form* before the end of the first week of classes. The form is available from the Office of Records and Registration.

SUMMER CREDIT HOUR LIMITS

- <u>Full-time day students who are not working</u> are permitted to take no more than eight (8) credit hours in the regular period and eight (8) credit hours in the intensive period.
- <u>Part-time day and evening students</u> are permitted to take no more than six (6) credit hours in the regular period and six (6) credit hours in the intensive period.

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FALL CREDIT HOUR LIMITS

- <u>Full-time day students</u> must be registered for at least 12 and no more than 16 credit hours in the regular period.
- <u>Part-time day and evening students</u> must be registered for at least eight (8) and no more than 11 credit hours in the regular period.

Students are permitted to be under-enrolled to the point of four (4) credits for the final term in which they are graduating, provided that they will have met the total of 89 credit hours necessary for graduation at the conclusion of that term. They may take no fewer than four (4) credits. Financial aid will be based on the number of credit hours taken, as long as at least four (4) credit hours are taken.

REPEAT COURSE

If you are repeating a required course, you MUST schedule an academic advising meeting with Assistant Dean DiSanza before your scheduled registration time for the upcoming semester(s).

CHANGING DIVISIONS

If you have received approval to switch divisions (day to evening/evening to day) for Summer 2014 or Fall 2014, you MUST report to the Office of Records & Registration to register by Friday, March 28 to ensure your priority time is correct based on your CURRENT (Spring 2014) status.

Under policies adopted by the Law School Council, all students who have earned less than a 2.000 cumulative grade point average at the end of their first academic program year or thereafter, will be academically dismissed. In order to petition for reinstatement, a student must have at least a 1.900 cumulative grade point average. Any student who fails to achieve a 1.900 grade point average will be academically withdrawn from all enrolled courses. Any student so withdrawn from Capital University Law School will be entitled to a full refund of future term enrolled tuition.

- Failure to drop or withdraw by the conclusion of the course will result in no refund and a failing grade of "E" on the transcript.
