941-1: Mediation Clinic (3cr) Wheeler	The professor will contact students prior to the first week of class to schedule two class meetings. The professor will attempt to schedule the two classes at a time convenient to all parties. The first class meeting, which will be held at the law school, will involve a review of the course syllabus along with other course forms and a skills review using mock mediations. This first meeting is usually 3-4 hours in length. The second class meeting will be held at the Franklin County Municipal Court so studentsn can meet the staff of the small claims court and the prosecutor's office as well as the magistrates of the small claims court. Most of the remainder of "class time" will be spent at the municipal court conducting and/or observing mediations in the small claims court in the afternoons from about 1:15 PM to 4:00 PM on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and/or Thursdays. Students must be available on at least one of these afternoons on most weeks in order to complete course requirements. Limited mediation opportunities are available in the prosecutor's office starting at either 5:00 PM or 6:00 PM on select evenings. Students may also have opportunities to observe mediations at other mediation programs. 943-1: Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) (1cr) Hoover Room A122	VITA is a one-credit course that will meet from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM on four consecutive Saturdays: January 13, January 20, January 27, and February 3.
