

Ohio IPV Community Collaborative Planning Group Charge

❖ Project Purpose

The overarching goal of the Ohio IPV Collaborative is to develop a model of agency/community collaboration for response to intimate partner violence, especially as addressed through an Alternative Response pathway, which can be replicated in other counties throughout Ohio.

❖ Planning Group Role

The role of the Planning Group is to sit in an advisory capacity in developing the model community collaboration plan, using as a guide local community plans developed by the project sites. The Planning Group will consist of representatives from the IPV project counties, other AR counties, and community partner organizations.

❖ Planning Group Responsibilities:

The planning group will meet periodically (typically via telephone conference) to review the status and progress of the project sites, track the development of community plans, assist in planning project stakeholder sessions, and assist with community capacity assessment, all aimed at the ultimate development of the model plan. In addition, task groups will be set up for more focused concentration on various components of the model plan.

❖ Planning Group Goals

The ultimate goal of the Planning Group is to make recommendations for the development of a replicable Ohio community collaboration model, using as framework the local community plans developed by the four project sites. The Planning Group's recommendations will serve as a guide for other counties looking to develop individual community response plans.

The Planning Group's recommendations should include the following components:

- ✓ A common vision developed among community partners in an effort to further collaboration,
- ✓ Strategies for improving the agency and community response to the batterer,
- ✓ A plan for sustainability.
- ✓ Instruction for batterer intervention counselors, and
- ✓ A structure for peer case review and/or an equivalent as identified by jurisdiction
