	CLINICS & EXTERNSHIPS
940-1: General Litigation Clinic (2cr) Bank Room A121	The General Litigation Clinic class is scheduled to meet on Wednesdays from 1:00 to 2:20 PM throughout the semester. For the first week of class, the class will meet on Wednesday, August 20, from 1:00 to 2:20 PM as scheduled. There will be additional classes to teach the procedural and substantive elements of these areas to prepare you at the outset to handle various types of cases, i.e., domestic, criminal, civil, etc. These classes are usually scheduled to start on the first Thursday immediately following the start of our regular Wednesday class for approximately seven (7) consecutive weekday mornings (August 22-August 30) from 7:30 to 8:50 AM . We have scheduled these early morning classes during the first weeks of school to avoid interfering with established schedules. The remaining reserved Wednesday 1:00 to 2:20 PM class times may be either in-person, asynchronous assignments on Echo360, or synchronous meetings via Zoom (or in-person when possible). You will be notified in advance of the meetings and/or assignments, not to exceed the reserved class time allocation. You will be provided a link, if applicable.
941-1: Mediation Clinic (3cr) Wheeler	The professor will contact students prior to the first week of class to schedule two class meetings. The professor will attempt to schedule the two classes at a time convenient to all parties. The first-class meeting, which will be held at the law school, will involve a review of the course syllabus along with other course forms and a skills review using mock mediations. This first meeting is usually 3-4 hours in length. The second-class meeting of about two hours will be held at the Franklin County Municipal Court so students can meet the staff of the small claims court and the prosecutor's office as well as the magistrates of the small claims court. Most of the remainder of "class time" will be spent conducting and/or observing mediations in the small claims court in the afternoons from about 1:15 PM to 4:00 PM on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and/or Thursdays. Students only need to be available one afternoon on a Tuesday, Wednesday OR Thursday. Limited mediation opportunities are available in the prosecutor's office starting at either 5:00 PM or 6:00 PM on select evenings. Students may also have opportunities to observe mediations at other locations such as the Ohio Civil Rights Commission and the Franklin County Domestic Relations Court Mediation Program. One-hour Zoom classes will be held throughout the semester at times convenient to students and professor. Questions should be directed to Professor Terry Wheeler.
944: Externships (2/3cr) Beem	To be enrolled in the externship course, students must apply through the Office of Professional Development and be approved by Assistant Dean Beem. Students are unable to enroll in the course via myCap. Students may seek 2 or 3 credits of externship during the fall semester. This course does not meet for a regular weekly class session. Approved students will complete asynchronous learning videos, submit course assignments via Canvas, and meet in person with their assigned faculty supervisor on two occasions scheduled via Canvas.

981 Courses	Courses designated as "981" satisfy both the Perspective and Upper-Level Writing graduation requirements, so long as the grade earned is a "C" or better.
Online Courses	Online courses will be taught fully online for the fall semester synchronously over Zoom as it currently appears on the schedule. Your professor may also assign asynchronous work where your professor provides materials for reading, lectures for viewing, and assignments for completing. Students then have the ability to access and complete the assignments within a time-period set by the professor.
